They will be focusing on the emotions of anger, anxiety, empathy, and gratitude this semester.

AT HOME EXPLORATION.....

Grow a RAINBOW

What you will need: Paper Towel, Washable Markers, Water, 2 Identical Glasses

Directions: Fold the paper towel in half horizontally. Cut off about 1/3 of the paper towel. Save the smaller section for later. Draw the rainbow colors on one end of the paper towel in rectangular blocks. Make sure to go over the colors a few times with markers, so there is enough dye to go up the towel. Repeat the same on the other end. Make sure the colors line up on both ends. Pour water into the two glasses until 3/4 full. Place the two ends of towels into the cups. 1/2 of the rainbow blocks should be in the water. Do not fully submerge the entire colored portion in the water. Watch the colors grow!
