Activity Duration: 30 minutes	Time management is key.

Instructions

Print onto thick paper or card, color all the parts of the apple tree and carefully cut everything out.

If using this activity as a simple cut and paste craft you can just print pages 1+2 and glue everything into place to match the image top right. (Some items have tabs for the math activity, these can be removed).

To use as a counting/math activity, leave the tabs on, keep the apples loose and cut all slots as indicated.

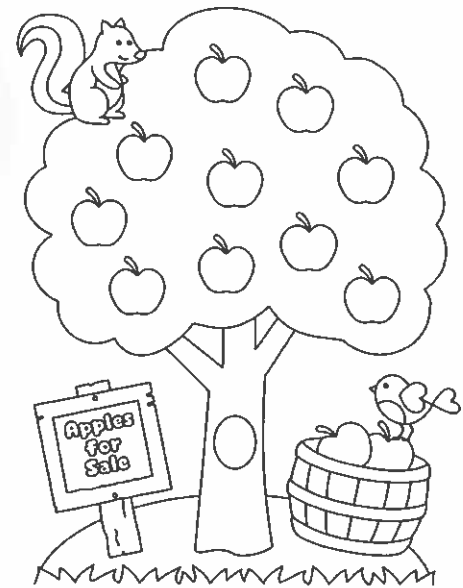

Orchards also provide habitat for a huge range of wildlife

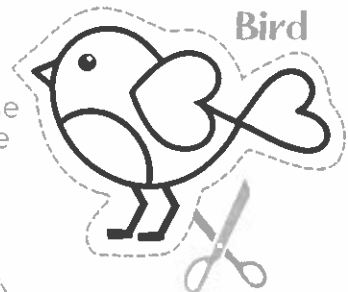
Fact

Glue these orchard friends onto the scene, or keep them loose to help with apple picking!



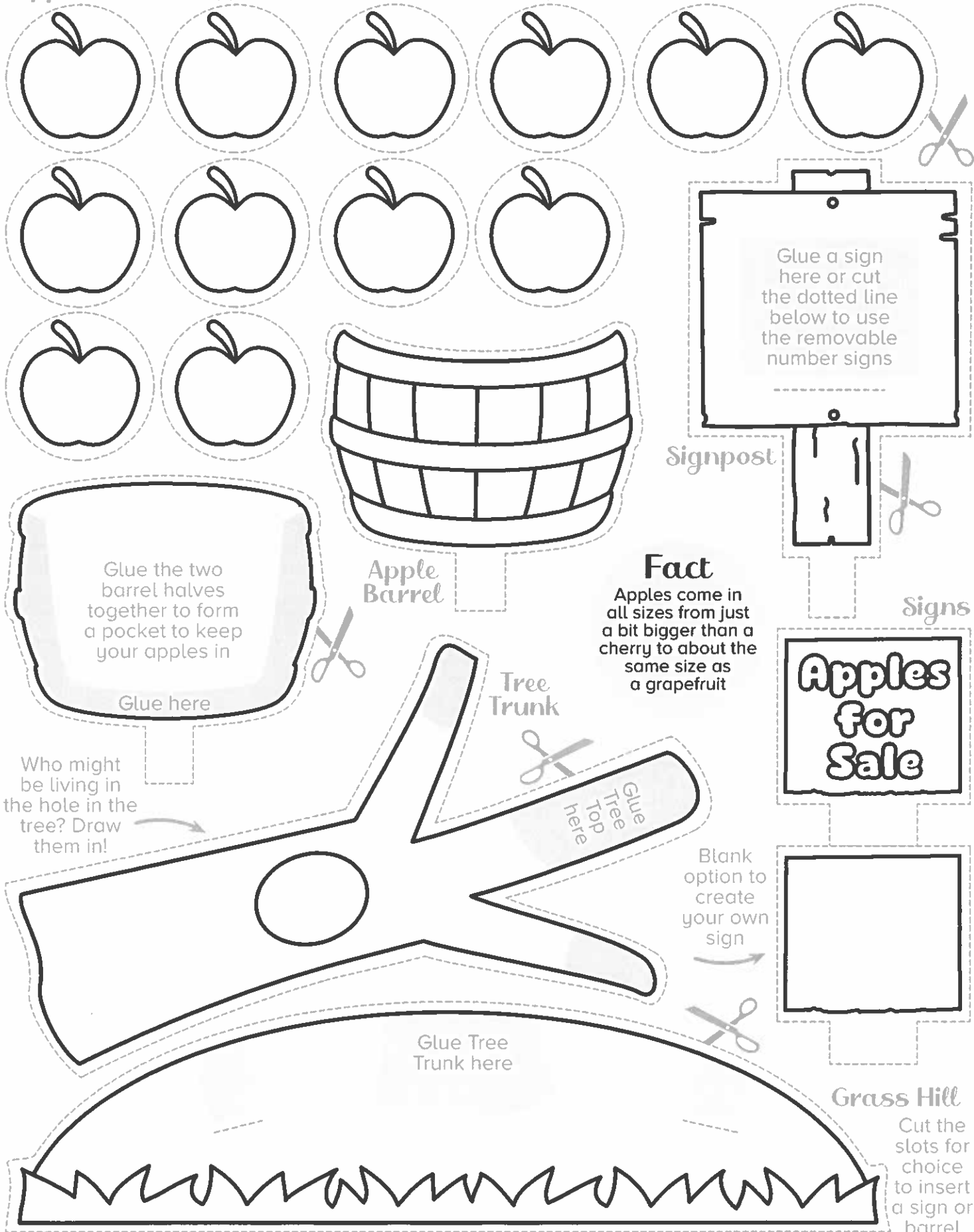

You can use these number signs in two ways:

TO ADD ON

Start with a bare tree and use the number cards to indicate how many apples to place onto the tree.

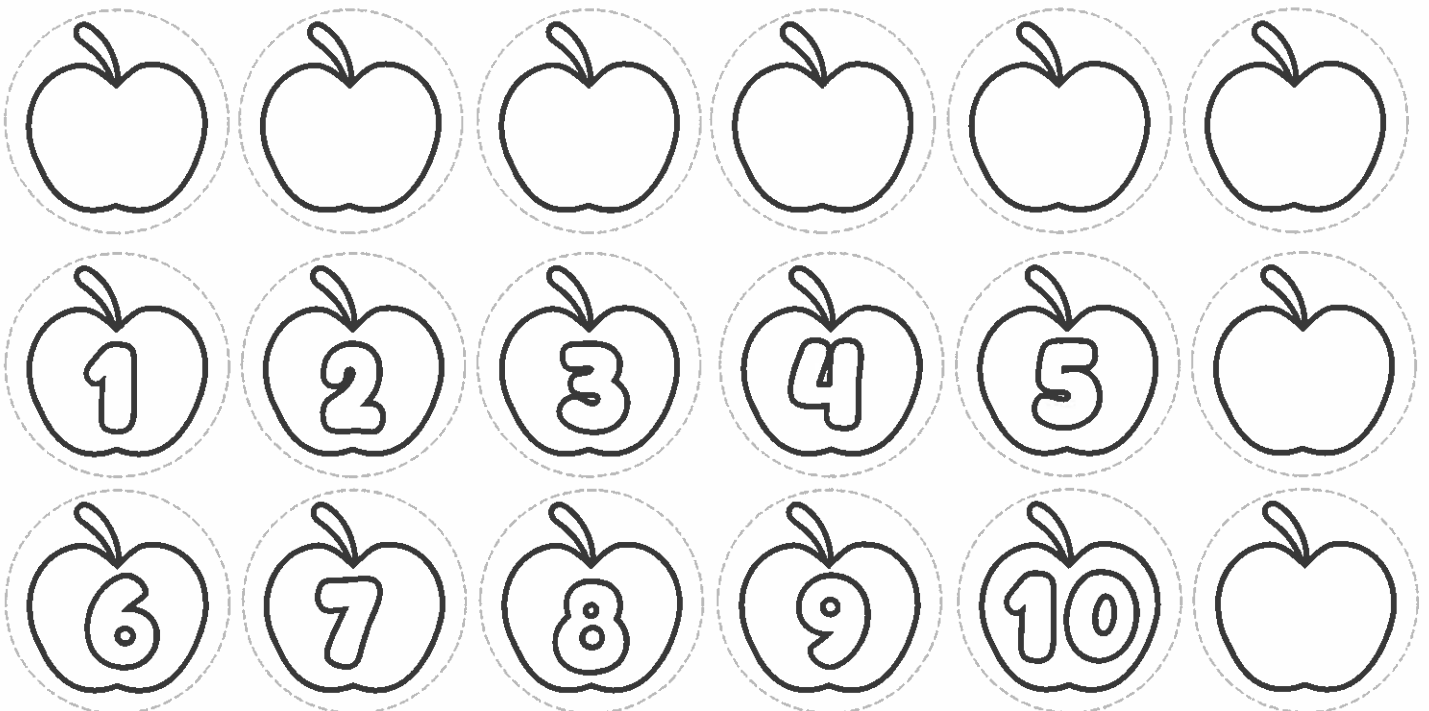
TO TAKE AWAY

Start with all the apples already on the tree and use the number cards to indicate how many apples should be 'picked' and taken away from the tree.

You can place the picked apples into the apple barrel below.

Start with 10 apples on the tree and you have a good activity to talk about number bonds to 10.

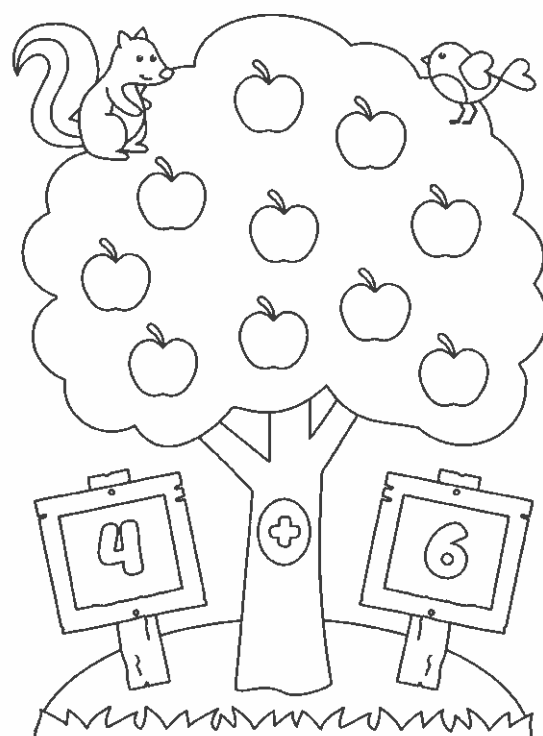
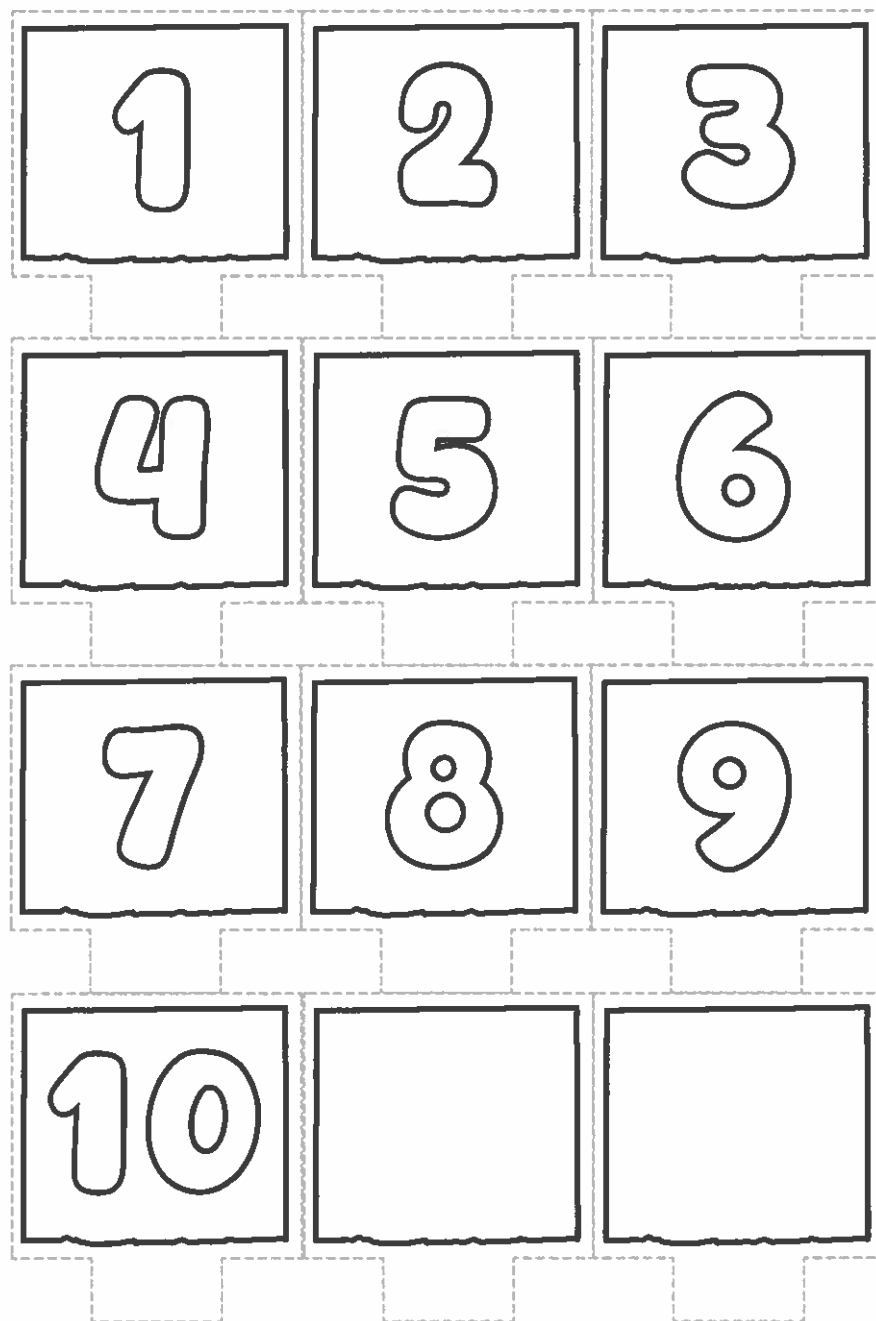
Extra Apples



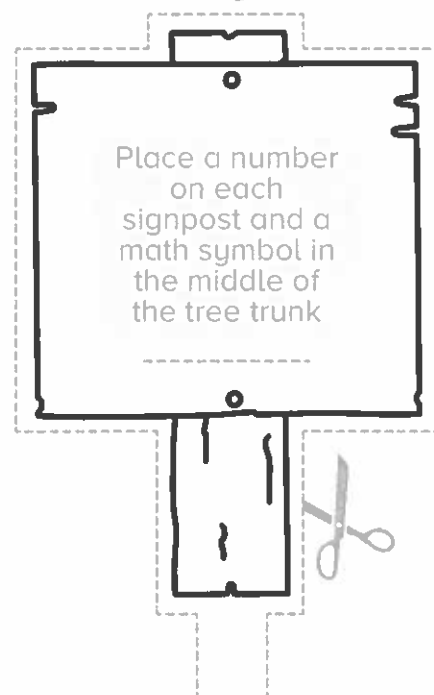
Optional Math Activity
